 - c) Explain the paradox in 'consumed with that which it was nourish'd by'.
 - d) 'And yet, by heaven, I think my love as rare' Why does the speaker think so?
 - e) 'And my delight is causer of this strife' Explain.

 - a) 'An Englishman cannot thrive or be ill or die without Scandinavian words' Discuss.
 - b) "The French were the rich, the powerful and the refined classes". Substantiate with appropriate linguistic evidence.
